Welcome to Artemis College!

Artemis College is the leading vocational Performing Arts college in Bracknell, Berkshire, based in the beautiful South Hill Park Arts Centre.

The college was launched in January 2018 and offers FREE government funded full time (including Gap Year) and low cost or free vocational part time performing arts training in Acting, Musical Theatre and Producing for 16–19 year olds, and free summer programs for teens aged 13-19.

We work with Big Creative Training, a large London school, to offer outstanding training in the heart of Berkshire. As a student of Artemis College, you will also be a BCT student. You can find out more about BCT at www.bigcreative.education.co.uk

All our tutors are qualified and practicing industry specialists. They include practitioners such as: Sam Spencer-Lane (West End choreographer and former head of Musical Theatre at Mountview); Charlotte Steel (Remember Monday, The Voice); Jonathan Ashby-Rock (Artistic Director, Hounslow Arts Centre) and many guests including: director Casey Andrews (Punchdrunk theatre company); technical specialist Stephen Harrison (Kylie, BBC Concert tours).

Students appear in a minimum of two shows each year, but can audition for up to 6 more!

We have guest workshop leaders, and throughout the year the full-time students visit a West End show, another live performance and, where possible, have a workshop or Q&A with a performer or creative associated with the shows. Recent shows with Q&A's

For our producers there is work experience at South Hill Park and Hounslow Arts Centres – running real shows for the public.

Full time students also enjoy visits and workshops to and from leading universities and conservatoires. We have an excellent track record of students joining high profile drama and dance schools and universities at the end of their course with us!

As well as the main college day (10-6 Tuesday – Friday) and public performances, full time students can join any of Artemis Studios' evening and weekend classes for free.

There is an annual trip (fees apply) to perform at Walt Disney World in Florida – an adventure our students have been enjoying since 2014.

All our courses have a maximum of 15 places available for September 2021 – so apply soon to get a place on the course that will get you to the next level in your career!

Standards are high and places limited - the course is free.

Level 3 Acting & Musical Theatre 2 Year Level 3 BTEC or RSL Extended Diploma*

This is a blended course in acting, singing and dancing. In addition, you will learn valuable business and producing skills which can be carried forward into adult life.

What will I learn? Developing the skills required for Film, TV and Theatre, you will explore techniques to improve confident, group work and sharing of dynamic and creative ideas which will ultimately prepare you for auditions and the professional industry.

The qualifications are designed to provide students with the knowledge, skills and understanding necessary to access and progress to degree level study or employment in the performing arts.

* You will be placed on either a BTEC National L3 Foundation Diploma, or an RSL Extended Certificate or Diploma in year one, based on your GCSE results (minimum 5 at grade 4 or above required), or SÉN.

A Broad Curriculum



Totally FREE* (funded) if you are still aged 18 on 1st August 2021.

Each term has a different focus, giving you the chance to stretch and improve your skills. It is intensive and requires a full commitment. You will appear in a large-scale musical production, an acted play for National Theatre Connections, and up to three additional full scale productions (Easter, summer and pantomime) with South Hill Park.

The course specialises in musical theatre, but it is blended and also offers acting, singing, screen acting, dance and technical aspects.

Recent graduates have gone on to universities such as Mountview, RCSSD, Chichester Conservatoire, GSA, Urdang and ICT.

Summer Intensive 16–19s: Lvl 2 & 3 • 3 week Musical Theatre course with qualification 13–15s: Lvl 1 & 2 • 2 week Musical Theatre course*


This is an intense summer training experience for musical-theatre performers (13-19) and trainee crew, costumiers, stage managers, lighting and sound, directors and event managers (16-19). mentored and taught by esteemed industry professionals. You will work towards the annual outdoor summer show at South Hill Park in the amphitheatre, and graded exams/qualifications. You must be available for all performances and rehearsals for a principle part.

For both cast and trainee creatives, a qualification to recognise your hard work will be taken at the end of the event. All grades at 6+ attract UCAS points. In the past two summers 100% of our musical-theatre performers achieved a Merit or Distinction!

Previous Productions







The cast will work on a production of the West End show *Godspell*, culminating in performances at the South Hill Park Amphitheatregiving you a chance to try site-specific outdoor theatre!

Participants will have the opportunity to work with top directors, choreographers, musical-theatre specialists, and backstage professionals, throughout the course.

This is an intense summer training experience that, for older participants, works towards graded exams/qualifications. You must be available for all show and rehearsals for a principle part. You can't be working on any other show or summer school at the same time.
